Prison Bars For Nemarluck

DARWIN, Thursday. — On Saturday night, Nemarluck, the notorious Fitzmaurice River aboriginal, will be behind bars at Fanny Bay Gaol after six months of liberty—providing he does not escape from his police escort.

Handcuffed to a black tracker, Nemarluck was brought in to Katherine last night by Constable Hoffman.

Sergeant Bridgland will escort Nemarluck from Katherine to Darwin on Saturday's train.

When Nemarluck's trial is over next month, there will be a big exodus of Fitzmaurice River aboriginal witnesses from Darwin, where they have been held and supported for more than two years while the police were chasing their elusive tribal overlord.
