Wreath Laid On English Grave Of Aborigine

LONDON, Monday.

In commemoration of the 153rd anniversary of the death of "Yem Murra Wanyea, an Australian aborigine, who was brought to Britain in 1793, the Australian High Commissioner (Mr Beazley) laid a wreath on the grave in the Eltham parish churchyard

He said that because the attitude of the British Commonwealth to native races had often been misrepresented at world conferences, the Commonwealth should make it clear that she was keen to help natives and deal with them progressively.

"It is our duty as á white race, to show the world our policy is one of helpfulness, so that native races may take their rightful place in 'the world," he added
