The protest, watched

by Sunday airport crowds, was over within minutes.

"Power to the people," grinned the leader of the delegation, Mr C.

"Chicka" Dixon, as he came out of Customs to a welcome of hugs, enthusiastic handshakes and excited shouts.

"For the first time in our lives we were treat-

our lives we were treat-ed as equals." he said. "We were never called boongs of niggers."

He read a statement that had been prepared by the delegation.

"The concern, care and respect accorded to members of the delegation as people and members of the aboriginal race, was unique in the experience of all the members."

The delegation was particularly impressed with the treatment of the 54 minority groups in China.
