

Militants 'testing bombs'

SYDNEY. — Militant aboriginals were experimenting with explosives in Sydney, a representative of the "aboriginal embassy" in Canberra, Mr John Newfong, said yesterday.

He said many aboriginals were fed up with talking and trying to get a better deal through political channels.

Because of this young radicals were less likely to be restrained by their elders.

There was talk of guerrilla warfare to try to achieve the aims, he said.

This warfare would not be aimed at people but could include blowing up bridges, he told an Australia Party Tuesday Club meeting in Sydney.

Asked what specifically the aboriginals might attack, Mr Newfong said he could not say what they might do.

But, hypothetically, "the line across the Nullarbor" was very important to the mining industry.
